READ THE TIMELINE OF EVENTS LEADING TO EASTER

GOD NEWS

MONDAY, MARCH 11: ISRAEL CELEBRATES PALM SUNDAY

Jesus enters Jerusalem amidst cheers and praises, fulfilling prophecy.

- Matthew 21:1-11
- Mark 11:1-11
- Luke 19:28-44
- · John 12:12-19

Reflection Questions:

- 1. How does the humility of Jesus in riding a donkey contrast with the expectations of a king?
- 2. Why do you think the crowds went from praising Jesus to calling for His crucifixion within a week?
- 3. In what ways can we offer genuine praise and surrender to Jesus in our lives today?

TUESDAY, MARCH 12: JESUS CLEANSES OF THE TEMPLE

Jesus cleanses the temple, driving out those who were buying and selling.

- Matthew 21:12-17
- Mark 11:15-19
- Luke 19:45-48

Reflection Ouestions:

- 1. Why do you think Jesus was so angered by the activities in the temple?
- 2. How does Jesus' actions in the temple challenge our understanding of reverence and worship?
- 3. What "tables" in our lives need cleansing to make way for true worship?

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 13: JESUS' AUTHORITY QUESTIONED

Religious leaders question Jesus' authority, leading to parables and challenges.

- Matthew 21:23-27
- Mark 11:27-33
- Luke 20:1-8

Reflection Questions:

- 1. What does Jesus' response to the religious leaders teach us about wisdom and authority?
- 2. How do we sometimes challenge Jesus' authority in our own lives?
- 3. In what ways can we acknowledge Jesus' authority and sovereignty more fully?



THURSDAY, MARCH 14: THE PARABLE OF THE TENANTS

Jesus tells the parable of the wicked tenants, revealing the consequences of rejecting God's messengers.

- Matthew 21:33-46
- Mark 12:1-12
- Luke 20:9-19

Reflection Questions:

- 1. How does the parable of the tenants reflect the relationship between God and humanity throughout history?
- 2. What are the "fruits" God expects from us as tenants of His creation?
- 3. How can we ensure that we are faithful stewards of God's blessings and responsibilities?

FRIDAY, MARCH 15: PAYING TAXES TO CAESAR

Jesus responds to a question about paying taxes, emphasizing the importance of both earthly and heavenly obligations.

- Matthew 22:15-22
- Mark 12:13-17
- Luke 20:20-26

Reflection Questions:

- 1. What does Jesus' response about paying taxes teach us about our responsibilities as citizens and as followers of Christ?
- 2. How do we balance our earthly duties with our allegiance to God?
- 3. In what ways can we "give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's" in our lives today?

SATURDAY, MARCH 16: THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT

Jesus summarizes the greatest commandments—love God and love your neighbor as yourself.

- Matthew 22:34-40
- Mark 12:28-34

Reflection Ouestions:

- 1. How does loving God and loving others encapsulate the essence of the Christian faith?
- 2. In what ways do we sometimes struggle to love God and love our neighbors as ourselves?
- 3. What practical steps can we take to grow in love for God and others?

SUNDAY, MARCH 17: WOES TO THE SCRIBES AND PHARISEES

Jesus condemns the religious leaders for their hypocrisy and self-righteousness.

• Matthew 23:1-39

Reflection Questions:

- 1. What are some examples of hypocrisy that Jesus condemns among the religious leaders?
- 2. How can we guard against hypocrisy in our own lives and communities?
- 3. In what ways can we strive for authentic faith and righteousness instead of outward appearances?

MONDAY, MARCH 18: WIDOW'S OFFERING AND THE SIGNS OF THE END TIMES

Jesus commends the widow's sacrificial offering and discusses the signs of the end times.

- Mark 12:41-44
- Luke 21:1-38

Reflection Ouestions:

- 1. What lessons can we learn from the widow's offering about sacrificial giving and trust in God?
- 2. How do the signs of the end times challenge us to live with a sense of urgency and preparedness?
- 3. In what ways can we invest our resources and energies in God's kingdom, following the example of the widow?

TUESDAY, MARCH 19: THE PLOT TO KILL JESUS

The religious leaders plot to kill Jesus as Passover approaches.

- Matthew 26:1-5
- Mark 14:1-2
- Luke 22:1-2

Reflection Questions:

- 1. Why do you think the religious leaders were so threatened by Jesus' teachings and actions?
- 2. How does the plot to kill Jesus reveal the depth of human sinfulness and resistance to God?
- 3. In what ways do we sometimes resist God's work in our lives and in the world?

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 20: JESUS' ANOINTING AT BETHANY

Jesus is anointed by Mary at Bethany, preparing Him for burial.

- Matthew 26:6-13
- Mark 14:3-9
- John 12:1-11

Reflection Questions:

- 1. What significance do you see in Mary's extravagant act of anointing Jesus?
- 2. How does Jesus' response to Mary's anointing challenge our understanding of devotion and sacrifice?
- 3. In what ways can we offer our most valuable possessions and resources in devotion to Jesus?

THURSDAY, MARCH 21: JUDAS AGREES TO BETRAY JESUS

Judas agrees to betray Jesus to the chief priests for thirty pieces of silver.

- Matthew 26:14-16
- Mark 14:10-11
- Luke 22:3-6

Reflection Ouestions:

- 1. Why do you think Judas chose to betray Jesus, and what motivations might have been behind his decision?
- 2. How does Judas' betrayal prompt us to examine our own loyalty and commitment to Jesus?
- 3. In what ways do we sometimes betray Jesus through our words, actions, or attitudes?

FRIDAY, MARCH 22: PREPARATION FOR THE PASSOVER

Jesus instructs His disciples to prepare for the Passover meal.

- Matthew 26:17-19
- Mark 14:12-16
- Luke 22:7-13

Reflection Questions:

- 1. What significance does the Passover meal hold for Jesus and His disciples?
- 2. How does the Passover meal foreshadow Jesus' sacrificial death and the new covenant?
- 3. In what ways can we celebrate the spiritual freedom and redemption we have through Jesus, our Passover Lamb?

SATURDAY, MARCH 23: THE LAST SUPPER

Jesus shares the Last Supper with His disciples, instituting the Lord's Supper and washing their feet.

- Matthew 26:20-30
- Mark 14:17-26
- Luke 22:14-30
- John 13:1-30

Reflection Questions:

- 1. What significance do you see in Jesus' act of washing His disciples' feet?
- 2. How does the Last Supper deepen our understanding of Jesus' sacrifice and His new covenant with us?
- 3. In what ways can we practice humility and servanthood in our relationships with others?

SUNDAY, MARCH 24: JESUS PREDICTS PETER'S DENIAL

Jesus predicts Peter's denial and the disciples' scattering.

- Matthew 26:31-35
- Mark 14:27-31
- Luke 22:31-38
- John 13:31-38

Reflection Questions:

- 1. Why do you think Peter and the disciples struggled to remain faithful to Jesus during His time of trial?
- 2. How does Jesus' prediction of Peter's denial demonstrate His understanding of human weakness and His unwavering love?
- 3. In what ways do we sometimes deny or betray Jesus in our own lives, and how can we find forgiveness and restoration?

MONDAY, MARCH 25: AGONY IN THE GARDEN

Jesus agonizes in prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, surrendering to the Father's will.

- Matthew 26:36-46
- Mark 14:32-42
- Luke 22:39-46

Reflection Ouestions:

- 1. What emotions and struggles do you think Jesus experienced in the Garden of Gethsemane?
- 2. How does Jesus' prayer in the garden model for us surrender and submission to God's will, even in the face of suffering?
- 3. In what ways can we trust God's will and find strength in prayer during our times of struggle and uncertainty?



TUESDAY, MARCH 26: THE BETRAYAL AND ARREST OF JESUS

Judas betrays Jesus with a kiss, leading to His arrest and abandonment by His disciples.

- Matthew 26:47-56
- Mark 14:43-52
- Luke 22:47-53
- John 18:1-12

Reflection Ouestions:

- 1. How do you think Jesus felt when Judas betrayed Him with a kiss, and His disciples abandoned Him?
- 2. How does Jesus' response to His arrest reveal His commitment to fulfilling God's redemptive plan?
- 3. In what ways do we sometimes betray or abandon Jesus in our own lives, and how can we remain faithful to Him?

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 27: JESUS BEFORE THE HIGH PRIEST

Jesus is brought before the high priest and faces false accusations and mockery.

- Matthew 26:57-68
- · Mark 14:53-65
- Luke 22:54, 63-71
- John 18:13-24

Reflection Ouestions:

- 1. How does Jesus' demeanor and responses during His trial before the high priest reveal His innocence and authority?
- 2. What do you think Jesus' silence in the face of false accusations teaches us about humility and trust in God's justice?
- 3. In what ways can we stand firm in our faith and integrity, even in the face of opposition and injustice?

THURSDAY, MARCH 28: PETER DENIES JESUS

Peter denies Jesus three times as predicted by Jesus.

- Matthew 26:69-75
- Mark 14:66-72
- Luke 22:55-62
- John 18:15-18, 25-27

Reflection Questions:

- 1. Why do you think Peter denied Jesus, despite his earlier declarations of loyalty?
- 2. How does Peter's denial prompt us to examine our own faithfulness and courage in difficult situations?
- 3. In what ways can we find forgiveness and restoration in Jesus, even after failing Him like Peter did?

FRIDAY, MARCH 29: JESUS BEFORE PILATE

Jesus is brought before Pilate, who finds no guilt in Him but yields to the crowd's demands for crucifixion.

- Matthew 27:1-2, 11-26
- Mark 15:1-15
- Luke 23:1-25
- John 18:28-19:16

Reflection Ouestions:

- 1. How does Pilate's handling of Jesus' trial reveal the pressures of political expediency and the cowardice of human leadership?
- 2. What does Jesus' silence in the face of Pilate's questions teach us about His confidence in His identity and mission?
- 3. In what ways can we resist the pressures of the world and stand for truth and justice, even when it's unpopular?



SATURDAY, MARCH 30: THE CRUCIFIXION AND DEATH OF JESUS

Jesus is crucified, suffers, and dies on the cross for the sins of humanity.

- Matthew 27:27-56
- · Mark 15:16-41
- Luke 23:26-49
- John 19:17-37

Reflection Ouestions:

- 1. How does the crucifixion of Jesus demonstrate the depth of God's love and the extent of human sinfulness?
- 2. What significance do you see in the various events surrounding Jesus' crucifixion, such as the darkness and the tearing of the temple curtain?
- 3. In what ways does Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross offer hope and redemption to all who believe?

EASTER SUNDAY, MARCH 31: JESUS' RESURRECTION, EMPTY TOMB, AND APPEARANCES

Jesus rises from the dead, conquering sin and death, and appears to His disciples.

- Matthew 28:1-20
- · Mark 16:1-20
- Luke 24:1-53
- · John 20:1-21:25

Reflection Questions:

- 1. What emotions and reactions do you think the disciples experienced upon discovering the empty tomb and encountering the risen Jesus?
- 2. How does Jesus' resurrection transform our understanding of life, death, and eternity?
- 3. In what ways does the reality of Jesus' resurrection impact our daily lives and our hope for the future?
